Gabrielle Collins, PhD candidate in Geography at the University of Nebraska-Lincoln, has taught for the last nine years as an adjunct professor at several Omaha area universities, including two years at the University of Nebraska-Omaha. She taught for four and a half years exclusively at Bellevue University, where she revised and taught multiple courses in geography and geology, both in the classroom and online. She has also developed and taught multiple curriculums at UNO's Aim for the Stars science camp each summer since 1999, and has been involved in research and laws regarding exotic animals for eight years – serving on the Board of Directors for a national organization (UAPPEAL), and acting as coordinator and web designer for a second (EPOU). Gabrielle received her B.S. (Geography / Geology) and M.A. (Physical Geography) from the University of Nebraska-Omaha, and has presented papers for the National Academy of Sciences (2001) and the International Geographical Union (Durban, South Africa, 2002). Her research interests are varied, and include such topics as wetlands hydrology, geoscience education, and the “biogeography” of exotic animals.
